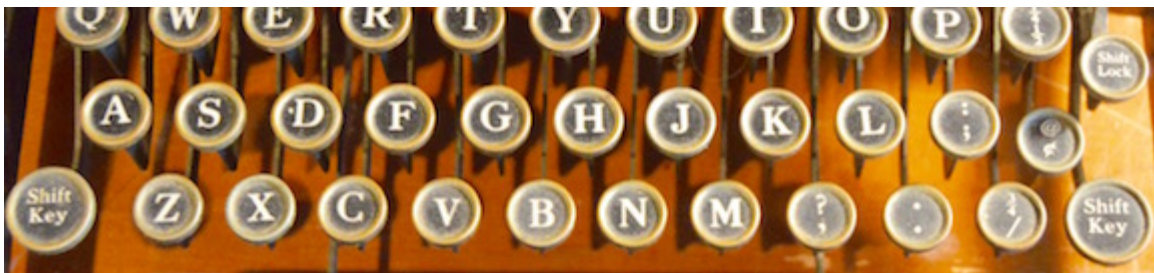

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Call for submissions: Bay to Ocean anthology





THE EASTERN SHORE WRITERS ASSOCIATION is reviving one of its oldest traditions, dating to the late 1980s, when ESWA published *Shore Writers' Sampler* and *Shore Writers' Sampler II: Stories and Poems by Eastern Shore Writers*.

We are soliciting contributions for a book-length anthology of our members' best writing, to be published in 2018. All ESWA members in good standing are invited to submit unpublished work in fiction, nonfiction, and poetry. *That means you!* The door is open. Only current and former ESWA members are eligible to contribute. Members who have lapsed will be able to restore their eligibility by paying their \$35 annual dues.

Deadline for submissions: February 15, 2018.

Criteria for acceptance: Excellence in writing. Our members' best work. Submissions can be stand-alone pieces or excerpts from work-in-progress, as long as they are new and original compositions that have not been published elsewhere, either online or in print.

Allowable topics or subject matter: whatever has elicited your best writing. Eastern Shore-related themes or subjects will be welcomed, but are not required.

Genres: fiction, nonfiction, and poetry.

Cover art: photographs, paintings, or drawings are invited, in either color or black and white. The editorial board as a whole will decide on the cover art, but may choose to use one or more submissions on inside pages, as well.

Length limits: as a general rule, no more than 5,000 words for fiction and nonfiction; no more than three poems from a single author. Exceptions can be made for work of exceptional quality; but exceptions are rare.

Compensation: each contributor will receive two free copies. Contributors may also buy additional copies at wholesale discount, either to give away or for resale like any other published work.

Reading fee: there is no reading fee, but submissions are only open to ESWA members in good standing. **Join or renew your membership today.**

Editorial Board: W. Scott Olsen, Moorhead, MN (editor, *Ascent*; professor, Concordia College; published author, eleven books), will serve as editor. The rest of the board consists of Ron Sauder (ESWA president, 2017), managing editor; Tery Griffin, ESWA member, fiction editor; Susan Parker and Emily Rich, ESWA members, nonfiction editors; and Pat Valdata, ESWA member, poetry editor.

SEND YOUR SUBMISSIONS BY EMAIL TO: Ron Sauder, managing editor, eswapresident17@gmail.com. Every submission will receive an acknowledgment from the managing editor. Please submit in standard Times New Roman (or equivalent) 12 point, double spaced, manuscript format. Submissions should not include the author's name or any identifying information. Submissions must be accompanied by a cover note that includes the writer's name, contact information, and titles of works submitted.

Christopher Tilghman is the author of two short story collections, *In a Father's Place*, and *The Way People Run*, and three novels, *Mason's Retreat*, *Roads of the Heart*, and *The Right-Hand Shore*. His short fiction has appeared in the *New*

Yorker and in many literary quarterlies, and has been selected three times for the Best American Short Stories and anthologized widely.

His honors include fellowships from the Guggenheim Foundation and Massachusetts Artists Foundation, and his awards include the Whiting Writer's Award and the Ingram Merrill Fellowship. He is a Professor of English at the University of Virginia, and divides his time between Charlottesville, Virginia and Centreville, Maryland.
